DIAA Overview

DIAA is a self supporting organization operating under the Delaware Department of Education. DIAA reports to the Associate Secretary for Student Support Programs and the DIAA Board of Directors. Majority of DIAA's revenue comes from ticket sales – DIAA is not supported financially by the Department of Education for our budget (operation expenses, staff salaries, etc.)

DIAA oversees middle and high school athletics for the state of Delaware for public, private and charter schools.

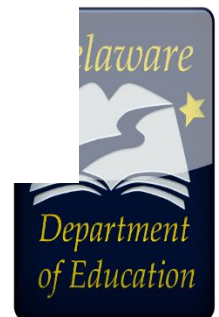


DIAA SODE Partnership

 - All players have sufficient knowledge of the sport, have a role on the team, and have an opportunity to play without heightened risk of injury

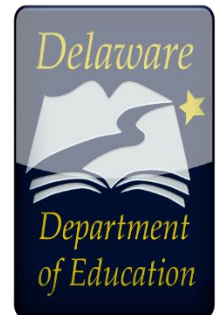

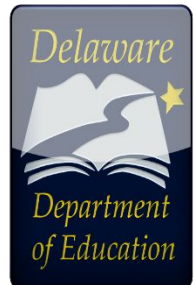

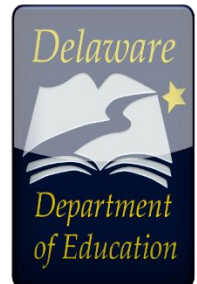

Athletic Director's Duty - Eligibility

- Know the DIAA Regulations!!!
- You are the enforcer in your school!
 - Athletic Eligibility
 - Coaches Eligibility
 - Coaching Out of Season/Open Gym
 - Annual Pre-participation Examinations (PPE) Physicals
 - Event sanctioning
 - Waiver requests



Athlete Eligibility Process

- a) Registration Verification
- b) Required Forms
- c) Physical Form Instructions
- d) Checklist

- Reminder, just because a student is enrolled does not mean they are ELIGIBLE for athletics.
- A schools obligation to educate does not carry the privilege to compete.



DIAA Basic Rules to Know

The 6 A's of Student Athlete Eligibility:

- 1. Area (of Residence) – Student must reside with custodial parent, legal guardian, relative care-giver or be 18. Student must live in geographic boundary of that school**
- 2. Attendance (Enrollment) – student must be legally enrolled and attend that school (that year and day)**



DIAA Basic Rules to Know

The 6 A's of Eligibility:

- 3. Age – student may not turn 19 before June 15 of that school year.**
- 4. Academics - As determined by MARKING PERIOD FINAL GRADES ONLY or Final Year Grade. Student must be passing 5 credits, 2 of which must be in Math, Social Studies, English or Science. Seniors MUST pass all courses needed to graduate.**
 - MS - 4 courses, 2 of which must be in English, Math, Science, Social Studies/World Languages.



DIAA Basic Rules to Know

5. Another School (Transfer Rule)

6. Amateur – Student must be an amateur athlete.

Length of Eligibility – students have 4 years from first entry to high school (9th grade)



DIAA Waivers

■ *Waivers*

- *Separate waiver hearings*
- *Waiver Request form must be received by the Executive Director **at least 21 calendar days** before the next regularly scheduled meeting of the DIAA and submit all required documentation in order to be placed on the agenda.*

DIAA Basic Rules to Know

Eligibility Protocol – continued....

Medical – student must have a current (completed after April 1) complete physical form on file with the school.

Length of Eligibility – students have 4 years from first entry to high school (9th grade)



Safety Training

- *ALL student athletes must have annual PPE*
- *Student athletes/Parents must sign the Concussion Information Sheet and Sudden Cardiac Arrest Fact Sheet on Consent Form*
- *DIAA added the requirement to complete NFHS Concussion in Sports online course for officials and amended certified, emergency and volunteer coaches every two years effective Dec 2020*
- *DIAA continues to annually provide sudden cardiac arrest awareness and education training and adheres to the guidelines pertaining to sudden cardiac arrest. (Training has been used to save lives during sporting events)*

 - Passing score of 85% on NFHS rules exam
 - Complete the NFHS “Concussion in Sports” course through NFHSLearn.com every 2 (two) years



Heads Up Certification

Approved by the DIAA Board of Directors in April 2021

- Each member school sponsoring football must identify a **“Player-Safety Coach”** who will be responsible for completing the USA Football’s Advanced Tackling and Blocking Systems during a two-year period prior to the start of DIFCA Safety Camp.
- This “Player-Safety Coach” is responsible for implementing and overseeing the primary components of Heads Up Football for their school.
- Per Regulation 1009 7.4.1 - Football coaches at all levels of competition shall annually compete Heads up Football training.



Concussion Protocol

If NOT CLEARED by QHCP at that time, athlete CANNOT return to play that day.

At this point, athlete must have written clearance from a QUALIFIED PHYSICIAN to return to practice or play.





Failure to comply = INELIGIBLE athlete

Practice Policies

DIAA Regulation 1008/1009.4.2

ALL practice days (school and non-school day):

- One day of no activity (practice, scrimmage, or contest) per seven day period
- A minimum of 21 calendar days of pre-practice prior to the first competition date (25 days for football)
- Student must practice at least 7 calendar days prior to participating in a contest



Practice Policies

DIAA Regulation 1008/1009

- **School day practices** are limited to two (2) hours which includes all instructional activity (team meetings, film, warm up/cool down sessions)
- **Practice on Non School Days:**
 - Each practice session should not exceed 3 hours
 - Two practice sessions are allowed which total five hours maximum - this includes a one-hour walk through session.
 - Dual session practices must be separated with at least one hour of recovery time.

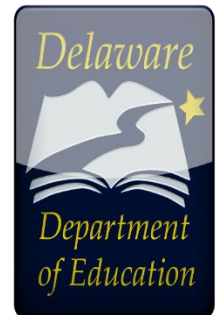
