



Criteria for the Delaware Certificate of Multiliteracy

The Delaware Department of Education has established a **Certificate of Multiliteracy** to recognize high school students who have attained a high level of proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English. Delaware high school students may apply for two levels of certificate:

- **Gold Level Certificate of Multiliteracy** for Intermediate-Mid level of proficiency
- **Diamond Level Certificate of Multiliteracy** for Advanced-Low level of proficiency

English Requirements (for both Certificates)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Receive at least a rating of Proficient (3) on the 8th Grade State Assessment of English Language Arts OR • Score at least a composite PL score of 4.0 on the ACCESS for ELs assessment taken during middle or high school OR • Receive a score of at least 390/410 on the English Language Arts (EBRW) section of the PSAT8/9 or 430 on PSAT10 or 460 on the PSAT/NMSQT OR • Receive at least a 480 cut score on the English Language Arts (EBRW) sections of the SAT
