2019-2020 DSSF GUIDANCE FOR ON TRACK ATTENDANCE (CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM)



This guidance document is designed to assist schools and districts in implementing the On Track Attendance (Chronic Absenteeism) measure of the Delaware School Success Framework (DSSF).

Overview of Measure

Chronic absenteeism from school, due to both excused and unexcused absences, represents instructional hours lost and is a predictor of lower levels of literacy by third grade, class failure in middle school, and higher numbers of high school dropouts (from Preventing Missed Opportunity: Taking Collective Action to Confront Chronic Absence). Chronically absent students include students who are absent for any reason (i.e., illness, medical clinic visits, out of school suspension, the need to care for a family member), for 10% of a school's total membership between September 30 and May 31, regardless of whether absences are excused or unexcused. Full day absences are utilized for this calculation, and the parameters for a "full day" are determined by local board policy. Early dismissals and late arrivals are not considered in this calculation.

This measure is represented in the accountability system as the percentage of students *not* chronically absent, which is the inverse of the percentage of students chronically absent, to represent school performance data in a positive manner.

Considerations for Data Entry in eSchoolPLUS

While local board policy will determine what is considered a full day absence, as well as whether the absence is deemed "excused" or "unexcused," each school's eSchoolPLUS setup should reflect local board policy. The DDOE Help Desk can provide support for eSchoolPLUS setup upon request.

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- The DDOE DSSF data system will pull attendance data from the DOEab view screen in eSchoolPLUS. Attendance codes as defined by local policy are *not* utilized by DDOE in the calculation of this measure.
- For unique educational opportunities that are **not considered "excused" absences** in the DOEab view screen in eSchoolPLUS (based on the school's eSchoolPLUS setup), such as school-sponsored field trips and other school-sponsored academic activities, it is recommended that school personnel enter the appropriate attendance code consistent with local board policy to properly document the reason why a student is not physically in the building. While attendance codes are determined at the local level, examples could include: FT = field trip, COL = college visit, SS = school sponsored, AC = Academic Challenge.
- For absences as a result of doctor's orders for homebound instruction, it is recommended that school personnel enter the appropriate absence code consistent with local board policy to properly document that the student is homebound. While attendance codes are determined at the local level, an example could include: HB = Homebound. Please note that not all districts/charters consider absences for homebound instruction as excused absences.

Considerations for Documentation for Appeals

The DDOE recognizes there are absences due to <u>extenuating circumstances</u> beyond the control of the family and/or beyond the control of the school. As a result, an appeals process through the existing annual Accountability Student Verification (ASV) process exists for the following extenuating circumstances, each of which requires specific supporting documentation to be considered:

- Students who are homebound (<u>ONLY if local policy requires that this is counted as an excused</u> <u>absence</u> – please refer to board policy to ensure alignment with your eSchool setup)
 - Signed doctor's note indicating specific date(s) of treatment. Anticipated dates will not be approved during the appeals process
- Students who are out of school for the immediate treatment of concussions should be excluded from the calculation
 - Signed doctor's note indicating date of concussion and specific date(s) of brain rest immediately following the diagnosis. Follow-up doctors' visits will not be approved during the appeals process
- Students who are placed in alternative residential facilities (e.g., Dover Behavioral Health)
 - Letter from the admitting facility with physician signature indicating **specific dates of service**. Anticipated dates of discharge will not be approved during the appeals process
- Students who are out of school for a death in the family
 - > Parent and/or guardian note with signature indicating specific dates of absence.
- In accordance with the <u>Interstate Military Compact</u>, students who are out of school as a result of a parent's active deployment
 - Signed parent and/or guardian note indicating date(s) of absence(s) with superintendent's signature as an assurance
- Students who are out of school for reasons specifically and directly related to homelessness
 - Signed note from the homeless liaison indicating specific date(s) of absence(s) and rationale for each appeal
- Students who are out of school for reasons specifically and directly related to foster care
 - Signed note from the foster care liaison indicating date(s) of absence(s) and rationale for absences (e.g., court date if full day absence)
- Students who are out of school for a full day for scheduled court appearance(s)

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- Court-issued documentation indicating date(s) of appearance(s)
- Students who are out of school for surgery and/or hospitalization
 - Signed doctor's note indicating specific date(s) of surgery and postoperative hospitalization, if applicable; follow-up doctors' visits will not be approved during the appeals process

Please note: Visits to the emergency room (unless documentation indicates that the visit resulted in a full-day absence from school the same day as the visit), doctor's office visits, and visits to walk-in medical clinics are not appealable absences.
