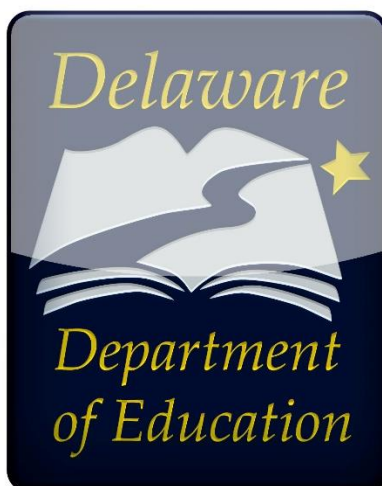

# Consent Education Annual Report\*

2021



As required under 14 Del C §4167

This resource provides data on evidence-based or evidence-informed consent education programs used in Delaware districts and charter schools. Consent education focuses on defining unambiguous, voluntary, and freely given agreement by all participants in each physical act in the course of sexual activity, including respect for personal boundaries.

## Background and Overview

On September 10, 2019, Senate Bill 78 of the 150<sup>th</sup> General Assembly was signed and made additions to Title 14, Chapter 41 § 4167 Consent Education. Consent education impacts educational programming and reporting. This is the first annual Consent Education Report. This report includes information related to implementation during the 2020-2021 school year.

The new statute reads:

*Educational Programming* - Beginning in the 2020-2021 school year, each school district and charter school serving 1 or more of the grades 7 through 12 shall provide age- and developmentally-appropriate, evidence-informed instruction on the meaning of consent and respecting others' personal boundaries as part of health standard programming related to comprehensive healthy relationships.

*Reporting* - Each school district and charter school shall designate an individual responsible for overseeing the implementation of the educational programming provided under subsection (a) of this section. Each school district and charter school shall provide the name and contact information for the individual designated under this subsection to the Department of Education no later than September 15 of each year.

- Each individual designated under paragraph (b)(1) of this section shall report to the Department of Education no later than November 15 of each year regarding how the educational programming has been implemented by that individual's school district or charter school.
- The Department of Education shall submit a written report to the Governor, the members of the General Assembly, and the Director of the Division of Research no later than January 15 of each year. The report must include the educational programming provided under subsection (a) of this section and how the curriculum has been implemented by each school district and charter school under subsection (a) of this section.

The following definition of "consent" was included in the statute and was added to [551 Regulation K-12 Comprehensive Health Education Program \(former Regulation 851\)](#):

- "Consent" means the unambiguous, voluntary, and freely given agreement by all participants in each physical act in the course of sexual activity, including respect for personal boundaries. Consent does not include any of the following: (a) the lack of verbal or physical resistance or submission resulting from the use of force, threat of force, or placing another individual in fear or (b) a current or previous dating, social or sexual relationship.

## Approach

As a result of the addition to Delaware Code, a small working group was developed and met in February 2020 to review available evidence-based and/or evidence-informed educational programming that would meet the requirements of new law within Regulation 851, which has since been renamed [Regulation 551](#). This working group was developed to identify potential educational programs that could be used to meet the needs of the requirement. The working group was co-chaired by Sabra Collins (Delaware Department of Education) and Tammy Croce (Delaware Association of School Administrators). Members included representatives from DDOE, CPAC, and several school districts as well as representatives from the Beau Biden Foundation.

The working group selected five evidence-based or evidence-informed training programs (listed below) that are available to attend to consent education. Unlike the Erin's Law requirement, consent education allows districts and charters local control and gives them the autonomy in selecting from the provided materials or any evidence-based, evidence-informed programming of their choice.

Information on these programs was provided to districts and charter schools in advance of the 2020-21 school year. **Appendix A** includes a copy of the original one pager identifying the programs and resources. DDOE provided support to districts and charter schools upon request as well as professional development opportunities from Amaze.org, One Love Foundation, Botvin and Planned Parenthood during July and August of 2020.

## District, Charter Reporting Process

For the purposes of this report, districts and charter schools submitted to the DDOE the evidence-based or evidence-informed education program(s) they implemented during the 2020-2021 school year, the person responsible for overseeing the requirement, the number of students instructed and the person(s) responsible for delivering the instruction in the 2020-2021 school. The districts and charters were not required to use one of the provided educational programs/resources. To collect this information, DDOE provided districts and charter schools with a report template to be completed no later than November 15, 2021.

Nineteen (19) districts and 20 charter schools serving students in pre-k through grade 6 completed this template (see **Appendix B**). Where data were not reported on the report template provided, DDOE used data from the Delaware Report Card.

## Results and Discussion

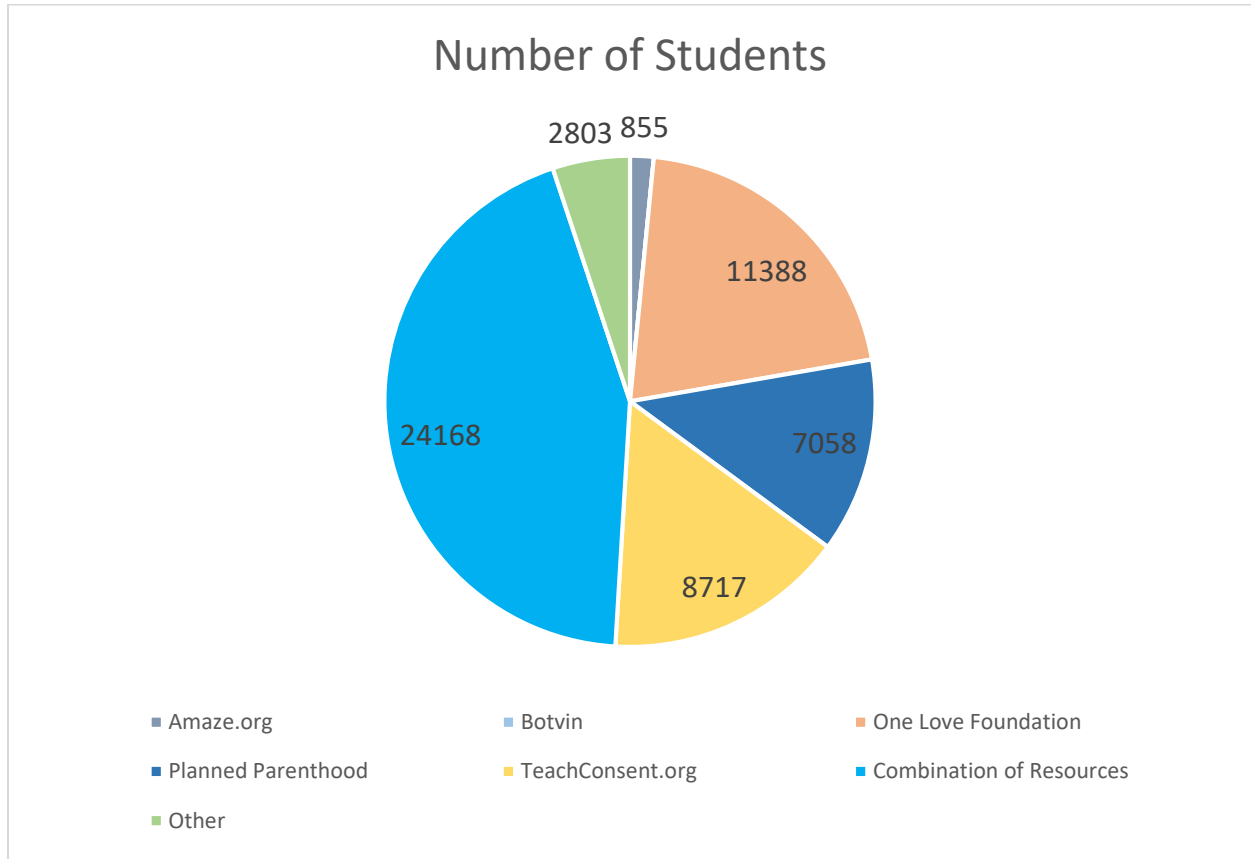
### Student Counts

It was reported that 54,989 students received age- and developmentally- appropriate instruction on the meaning of Consent and respecting others' personal boundaries, during the 2020-2021 school year.

For the 2020-21 school year, Delaware teachers and students saw a change in how instruction was delivered because of the pandemic. For instance, teachers and schools restructured some of their material to reflect a remote setting. The impacted districts and charters are noted in the chart below.

The table below shows the breakdown of the different programs that were used within district and charter schools to attend to consent education during health education programming. The table below also details if districts or charters instruction of consent education programming was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic during the 2020-2021 school year.

## Consent Education Information

There was an addition to Delaware Code last session that requires consent be taught in grades 7-12. (Copied below.) This goes into effect with the next school year – 2020-2021.

The Department pulled together a work group to help identify educational programming to assist the districts and schools. *3. The Department of Education shall submit a written report to the Governor, the members of the General Assembly, and the Director of the Division of Research no later than January 15 of each year. The report must include the educational programming provided under subsection (a) of this section and how the curriculum has been implemented by each school district and charter school under subsection (a) of this section.*

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### **Grades 10-12 Advisory Class**

Students attend Advisory Class four times per week. The Advisory serves as a support system for all students. It is a place where students can feel safe and connected to staff and other students. Students will focus on personal and academic growth while acquiring the necessary life skills needed to become a productive and positive citizen. Students will be actively engaged in creating an environment where diversity is appreciated and develop the self-esteem necessary to feel that they can make a difference in the world.

Advisory offers emotional support for students during adolescence. The social networks that are so important at this age can be disrupted by the transfer to high school. Advisory offers support in two forms. First, it supplies built-in peer groups for all students in a high school, including new students. Second, it gives students an adult who knows them well and who can offer advocacy and support in difficult social and academic situations. This is especially true for students who have few close adult relationships outside school or are at risk of dropping out. Ideally, the advisory teacher is someone the student knows he or she can trust and talk to about his or her progress and standing in the school.

Advocates of advisory programs see a direct link between a student’s emotional and social experience and academic achievement. Advisory promotes self-esteem. It provides peer recognition in an accepting environment, offsetting peer pressure and negative responses from peers in other areas. Students in advisory programs are less likely to drop out and have a lower incidence of substance abuse. By having a more in-depth relationship with teachers, parents are more informed about their child’s academic needs and successes and can better support them.

In order for an advisory to be effective, it must reflect and be a substantial component of the school’s mission. An advisory is not just an “add-on” to the curriculum: it requires a substantial investment of time, planning and reflection. Even schools that have maintained their advisories over many years constantly reconfigure them -- often every year -- in order to effectively address the needs of students and the school.

Advisory provides a personalized and trusting environment that nurtures the physical and emotional well-being of all students and supports academic success through the building of community and the ability to make sound moral and ethical life choices.

Non-Academic Topics Covered in Advisory: Internet safety, personal safety, making the right choices, Bullying, Dating Violence, building healthy relationships, anxiety/stress/mental health, defining respect and respecting others.

### **ECHS Parent Academy 2020-21**

Parent Academy will be held immediately following the monthly PTSA business meeting. Parent Academy is designed to educate parents on varying academic subjects like college readiness, college application, studying habits, etc. In addition, Guest speakers provide presentations on internet safety, bullying, dating violence, healthy teen relationships, Title IX, etc. These Academy sessions are held monthly for one hour.

Teachers can expect an unparalleled array of resources delivered online via iPad, Android or DVD, including a variety of differentiated instruction components that support academic achievement at every learning level.
  - Advisory Classes are each day for one hour for all four grades.
  - PTSA Parent Academies are held once per month for one hour.
  - Brandywine Counseling & Community Services is a new partner for ECHS@DSU. Currently, it provides prevention education programs through its SQUAD (Students on a Quest Uniting Against Drugs/Alcohol) and Pop (Peer Outreach for Prevention) through the ECHS Health classes for Grade 9. With the ECHS College Readiness Hornet Help Program, Brandywine Counseling can provide more programming for families as well as students.
  - The Center for Child Development provides professional therapists who partner with school districts to provide mental health services directly in the schools. The therapists are trained to handle issues such as depression, anxiety, self-esteem, poor social skills, anger management, etc. Counseling is offered on a voluntary basis and provided in the school setting. Services include individual, family and group counseling, as appropriate. Counseling will not conflict with academics; rather it is hoped that it will enhance academics as well as, other aspects of the child's and family life. The CCD also provides workshops for parents and teens.
  - The Delaware State University Title IX Compliance educates ECHS staff, students, and parents on issue/questions/concerns regarding Title IX.

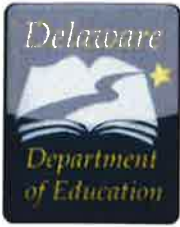

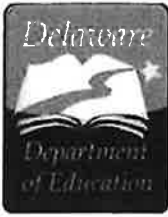

**The School Nurse, School Counselor and Health and Physical Education Teacher will work together to schedule and implement an evidenced- based, age-appropriate consent curriculum lesson as part of the Health Standard Program. Our 7<sup>th</sup> grade is introduced to Planned Parenthood’s 8 week program, Healthy Boundaries. It covers a multitude of information, of which consent and healthy boundaries is discussed in detail. The 8 week program consists of 8, 60 minute sessions. This program is organized annually by our school counselor. The B.E.S.M.A.R.T. program is implemented for the lower grades which also starts the conversation about consent and safety in additional to responsive classroom meetings, so when they reach 7<sup>th</sup> grade, they have a structured platform and understanding. The B.E.S.M.A.R.T. program is overseen by the school nurse. Our 8<sup>th</sup> grade student population continues with consent and healthy boundaries delivered specifically in health but also reinforced in the classroom with Responsive Classroom in morning meetings and building community. This happens for all grades. For younger children, this helps teaching consent with the focus of social skills that kids need for future adolescent interactions and friendships. The health lessons are organized by the Physical Education teacher, with input from both the school counselor and school nurse.**

**As noted above, Healthy Boundaries by Planned Parenthood is an 8 week, 60 min sessions for 7<sup>th</sup> grade. 8<sup>th</sup> grade gets a minimum of 5 health classes specific to this topic, 30 minutes each and applies the State Health Models and Structure for healthy relationships. Depending on the topic and need, more health lessons can be added in throughout the year. Responsive Classroom morning meetings, also include lesson practices and conversations to reinforce what they have learned in health class in a societal manner of boundaries and language. The skills you learn for setting healthy boundaries and consent are not just about dating and romantic relationships, they are also conflict resolution, teaching personal boundaries, accepting rejection, even if not in a romantic term. Implementation of these lessons consist of online platforms such as kami, nearpod, and zoom layered in with**

**worksheets and hands-on materials incorporated to better show effective understanding. Furthermore, we have discussed with our teachers that consent can also be presented in the classroom for core subjects like history and science when discussing colonization, civil rights, and the woman's movement. Gateway Lab Charter School takes this very seriously primarily when understanding our student population.**

This program includes five lessons to encourage middle school students to think critically about healthy relationships, power dynamics, boundaries, and consent. These lessons teach students what to do, instead of what not to do.

These lessons will be taught to 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> graders through their PE/Health class during the 2021-2022 school year. Each year after, (2022-2023 and beyond), the lessons will be taught to 7<sup>th</sup> graders and any new students attending POCS in grades 8 and 9.

### **Girls Empowered**

This is a monthly program that has been implemented to empower the female students who attend POCS. Our Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) organizes guest speakers, outside agencies who instruct our students, and develops lessons of our own to address issues such as body image, social media, healthy relationships, etc.

During the 2021/2022 school year, female students are meeting weekly for 45 minutes with instructors from the Delaware Adolescent Program Inc. (DAPI) to complete a 13-week curriculum called Love Notes. This has been organized through Girls Empowered by our LCSW. The curriculum addresses making wise relationship and sexual choices, focuses on recognizing your own values, understanding red flags of unhealthy relationships, and developing skills to form and maintain healthy relationships.

We intend to continue implementing this in the Fall of school years to come, as long as DAPI is still providing this curriculum instruction to the community.

### **Guys Group**

It was difficult to engage students authentically without being able to see them (over Zoom) or with so few students in attendance in person. There was an additional concern that without being in-person, students could venture off on their own without the proper adult supervision and oversight.*

*Christiana Honors Academy - There was not a 7th grade health teacher last year*

*DSD -While remote, it was difficult to send the message across-most of the middle school. The curriculum was implemented weekly for about 20 minutes using Planned parenthood. Not all students participated and there was a lack of students during remote instruction. Only one high school student attended regularly.*

*Glasgow HS - Used ARC in Health classes to cover consent. It was also covered for a few class periods using handouts and PowerPoint presentations on consent and boundaries.*

*The Bancroft School - there was not a health teacher last year for 7th grade.*

As indicated above, the Indian River School District has provided all middle and high school Health teachers with two resources: our approved HealthSmart curriculum and teachconsent.org. Consent education instruction is planned collaboratively through district PLCs which are held up to 3 times per year on calendared district-wide Professional Learning Days. IRSD Health teachers also have a collaborative Schoology page where they share ideas and resources that can be used in their instructional planning, including consent education.

In middle schools, consent education is delivered during an 8th grade Family Health and Sexuality unit which teaches students about healthy boundaries in relationships and how to communicate overall in a relationship, including communicating personal boundaries. Beginning in 2020, this 8th grade content will be adapted for use with 7th grade students as well. In high schools, consent education is covered through a unit on Mental and Emotional health which discusses developing and communicating healthy boundaries. The length of time engaged in consent education ranges from one full lesson that can take anywhere from 1 to 3 classroom periods of at least 40 minutes each, to two to three lessons that may take a full week of classroom instruction.

Specifically, students work through video lessons with evidence-based responses (page 88), question and answer discussions (page 91), affirming beliefs (page 92), practicing skills (page 109), key learnings (page 112), and role play practice (page 143).

Aspects of this program are also pulled out and added to an earlier unit (Injury Prevention) during the Healthy and Unhealthy relationships section. These specific lessons cover consent for an average of 2 total hours. The Sexual Health unit covers consent for an average of 3-4 total hours.
