Hello Early Childhood Community,

There has been lots of activity in our state promoting the holistic growth of our earliest learners and supporting our early childhood care and education system, including the Developmental Screening project.

- As you know, ages 0-5 are the most critical for brain development and setting the foundation for each and every child's future! Sharing knowledge with families about child development can empower them as the expert on their own child assuring their role as a critical member of their child's educational team.
- In preparation for HB202 Developmental Screening Bill (effective 7/1/2023) and SB169/SB214 Delaware Child Care Act (effective 7/1/2024), we have several updates and reminders for the implementation and expansion of our current system.
- The Delaware Department of Education is charged with creating the plan and implementing the new
 developmental screening requirements, while continuing the work that is already well underway. This
 includes standardizing messaging and materials to support you and your families to engage in
 developmental monitoring and screening activities.
- As this project grows, responsibilities for both providers and reviewers will continue to pivot. Your role as a partner to families is more important now than ever to support the education about and completion of the developmental and social emotional screening for their child.

ASQ Provider Technical Assistance Manual (Early Childhood Programs) This manual guides you through the process to successfully implement developmental screening in your program and provides materials to share with families for them to complete the screeners. This resource is most helpful after you have an account and are ready to start sharing the family access portal links with families.
