One of the skills that you will be expected to master is the ability to draw conclusions just like you did in the Warm-up.

To be believable, conclusions must be well-supported.

Historians are professionals who know how important it is to support their conclusions with evidence. If they want to be believed, they must provide facts and other information that convinces people that their conclusions are correct.

Evidence - facts or information that leads intelligent people to accept that something is true or worthy of believing.
