

**Utopia** is an imagined place or state of things in which everything is perfect.




Let's develop our own understanding of utopia by defining it, describing what your utopia would be like, and drawing what your utopia would look like.

## Resource 2: Summary of Thomas More's Utopia

Utopia was an imaginary island in the New World that Columbus discovered and that is now called America. It was built on an island so that it was separated from the problems

of the rest of the world. It was a place that was very different from England. It was a perfect place. The drawing to the right is the Utopia that appeared in More's book.


In England there were a lot of very, very poor people. Meanwhile, a very small group of people owned almost everything. In Utopia, no one was richer than anyone else and people shared almost all of the island's resources.

In England, a person could be put to death if he stole something. In Utopia, this punishment was considered too harsh.

If a person was sick or injured in England, the government did not take care of her. In Utopia, every sick and injured person was cared for.

In England, the law said that a person could be thrown in jail or put to death if he did not belong to England's official religion - the

Anglican religion. In Utopia everyone was allowed to practice many religions.



In England, the king or queen claimed that God gave them the right to rule the country and only members of their family were allowed to have power. In Utopia, the people choose their leaders.

Times have changed since the time when Thomas More wrote Utopia. So, it may not be what you consider a utopia but it was to the people who lived in England when the book was written
