What are taxes and what might be some of their purposes?

You are going to randomly be assigned role card.

- 1. Members of Parliament will draw a card.
- 2. Parliament members will announce to the colonists which item will be taxed.
- 3. Anyone possessing that item will have to pay out the number of M&Ms equal to the number written on the object card.
- 4. The Tax Collector will collect all the taxes. The taxes will be paid to Parliament.

Taxes have been collected

- 1. Tax Collectors: 10%
- 2. Parlament: 50%
- 3. King George: 40%

Resource 4: Checks for Understanding

Two accounts of the M&M activity appear below. Read the two accounts then answer questions 1 and 2.

Account 1

The decision to tax and the decision to tax sneakers were both fair. Governments tax all the time so that they can pay for important things like hospitals, fire stations, roads etc. Most students wear sneakers so almost everyone got taxed.

Conclusion of the King and Parliament

Account 2

The decisions to tax and tax sneakers were VERY unfair. Government's should not be able to take away people's property unless they have been given the opportunity to explain why they should or should not be taxed. This did not happen. And everyone did not get taxed the same because not everyone was wearing sneaks.
