The goal of this contracted employee is to provide the needs and meeting those needs of our EL/Students classified as living in poverty is a focus for us every year. We recognize that many of our low income and EL students have demonstrated difficulty with anxiety, attention/concentration, participation and involvement with academic work, and feelings associated with grief and loss as a direct result of increased exposure to trauma within the home environment. Since the closure as related to the pandemic, our low income and EL students, in particular, have struggled with gaining access to equitable mental health opportunities to foster the processing of the aforementioned difficulties. As expected, data suggested that our low-income students have regressed in their academic progress and achievement without the consistent in-person instruction and immersion into the curriculum. Therefore, we intend to use the funds to offer tiered therapeutic support through contracted psychological services to provide support to our low income and EL students. Contracted services will address student needs through weekly small group and individualized support. The target goals of support with focus on mindfulness, coping skills that can translate to the learning space, and processing of feelings related to the experience of trauma.
