* School Counselor (Grades 6-8) (Partial FTE)	* \$ 46,929.00	* The School Counselor will provide individual counseling, small group counseling, and group guidance to help multilingual learners and socioeconomic disadvantaged students to cope effectively with personal, social, academic, and family concerns. Academic and behavior data from these students will be analyzed and adjustments will be made as needed in order to make sure they are supported.
* Reading Interventionist (3-12)	* \$ 79,350.00	* Working directly with the Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Coordinator, the Reading Interventionist will help identify strategies and resources to support at-risk populations. Students will be pulled in small groups on a weekly basis in order to receive intervention support, specifically in reading. Students will be using not only direct instruction by the teacher, but also instruction through programs such as Amplify's Boost, iReady, and Magnetics. Through these additional supports, the students will become proficient readers and improve their performance on ELA assessments, as well as Smarter Balanced and iReady assessments.
