Consent Education Annual Report* 2023



*As required under 14 Del C §4167

This resource provides data on evidence-based or evidence-informed consent education programs used in Delaware districts and charter schools. Consent education focuses on defining unambiguous, voluntary, and freely given agreement by all participants in each physical act in the course of sexual activity, including respect for personal boundaries.

Background and Overview

On September 10, 2019, Senate Bill 78 of the 150th General Assembly was signed and made additions to Title 14, Chapter 41 § 4167 Consent Education. Consent education impacts educational programming and reporting. This is the third annual Consent Education Report. This report includes information related to implementation during the 2022-2023 school year.

The new statute reads:

Educational Programming - Beginning in the 2020-2021 school year, each school district and charter school serving 1 or more of the grades 7 through 12 shall provide age- and developmentally appropriate, evidence-informed instruction on the meaning of consent and respecting others' personal boundaries as part of health standard programming related to comprehensive healthy relationships.

Reporting - Each school district and charter school shall designate an individual responsible for overseeing the implementation of the educational programing provided under subsection (a) of this section. Each school district and charter school shall provide the name and contact information for the individual designated under this subsection to the Department of Education no later than September 15 of each year.

- Each individual designated under paragraph (b)(1) of this section shall report to the Department of Education no later than November 15 of each year regarding how the educational programming has been implemented by that individual's school district or charter school.
- The Department of Education shall submit a written report to the Governor, the members of the General Assembly, and the Director of the Division of Research no later than January 15 of each year. The report must include the educational programing provided under subsection (a) of this section and how the curriculum has been implemented by each school district and charter school under subsection (a) of this section.

The following definition of "consent" was included in the statute and was added to <u>551 Regulation K-12</u> Comprehensive Health Education Program:

"Consent" means the unambiguous, voluntary, and freely given agreement by all participants in each physical act in the course of sexual activity, including respect for personal boundaries. Consent does not include any of the following: (a) the lack of verbal or physical resistance or submission resulting from the use of force, threat of force, or placing another individual in fear or (b) a current or previous dating, social or sexual relationship.

Approach

As a result of the addition to Delaware Code, a small working group was developed and met in February 2020 to review available evidence-based and/or evidence-informed educational programming that would meet the requirements of new law within Regulation 851, which has since been renamed Regulation 551. This working group was developed to identify potential educational programs that could be used to meet the needs of the requirement. The working group was co-chaired by Sabra Collins (Delaware Department of Education) and Tammy Croce (Delaware Association of School Administrators). Members included representatives from DDOE, CPAC, and several school districts as well as representatives from the Beau Biden Foundation.

The working group selected five evidence-based or evidence-informed training programs (listed below) that are available to attend to consent education. Unlike the Erin's Law requirement, consent education allows districts and charters local control and gives them the autonomy in selecting from the provided materials or any evidence-based, evidence-informed programming of their choice.

Information on these programs was provided to districts and charter schools in advance of the 2020-21 school year. The Education Associate for Physical Education, Health and Wellness at the Department continues to share information about Consent Education programming with the Health and Physical Education (HPE) Advisory group. **Appendix A** includes a copy of the original one pager identifying the programs and resources. DDOE provided support to districts and charter schools upon request as well as professional development opportunities from Amaze.org, One Love Foundation, Botvin and Planned Parenthood during July and August of 2020.

District, Charter Reporting Process

For the purposes of this report, districts and charter schools submitted to the DDOE the evidence-based or evidence-informed education program(s) they implemented during the 2022-2023 school year, the person responsible for overseeing the requirement, the number of students instructed and the person(s) responsible for delivering the instruction in the 2022-2023 school year. The districts and charters were not required to use one of the provided educational programs/resources. To collect this information, DDOE provided districts and charter schools with a report template to be completed no later than November 15, 2023.

Nineteen (19) districts and 20 charter schools serving students in pre-k through grade 6 completed this template (see **Appendix B**). Where data were not reported on the report template provided, DDOE used data from the Delaware Report Card.


Results and Discussion

Student Counts

It was reported that 59,767 students received age- and developmentally- appropriate instruction on the meaning of Consent and respecting others' personal boundaries, during the 2022-2023 school year.

APPENDIX A

Consent Education Information

There was an addition to Delaware Code last session that requires consent be taught in grades 7-12. (Copied below.) This goes into effect with the next school year – 2020-2021.

The Department pulled together a work group to help identify educational programming to assist the districts and schools. Grades 10-12 Advisory Class

Students attend Advisory Class four times per week. The Advisory serves as a support system for all students. It is a place where students can feel safe and connected to staff and other students. Students will focus on personal and academic growth while acquiring the necessary life skills needed to become a productive and positive citizen. Students will be actively engaged in creating an environment where diversity is appreciated and develop the self-esteem necessary to feel that they can make a difference in the world.

Advisory offers emotional support for students during adolescence. The social networks that are so important at this age can be disrupted by the transfer to high school. Advisory offers support in two forms. First, it supplies built-in peer groups for all students in a high school, including new students. Second, it gives students an adult who knows them well and who can offer advocacy and support in difficult social and academic situations. This is especially true for students who have few close adult relationships outside school or are at risk of dropping out. Ideally, the advisory teacher is someone the student knows he or she can trust and talk to about his or her progress and standing in the school.

Advocates of advisory programs see a direct link between a student's emotional and social experience and academic achievement. Advisory promotes self-esteem. It provides peer recognition in an accepting environment, offsetting peer pressure and negative responses from peers in other areas. Students in advisory programs are less likely to drop out and have a lower incidence of substance abuse. By having a more in-depth relationship with teachers, parents are more informed about their child's academic needs and successes and can better support them.

In order for an advisory to be effective, it must reflect and be a substantial component of the school's mission. An advisory is not just an "add-on" to the curriculum: it requires a substantial investment of time, planning and reflection. Even schools that have maintained their advisories over many years constantly reconfigure them -- often every year -- in order to effectively address the needs of students and the school.

Advisory provides a personalized and trusting environment that nurtures the physical and emotional well-being of all students and supports academic success through the building of community and the ability to make sound moral and ethical life choices.

Non-Academic Topics Covered in Advisory: Internet safety, personal safety, making the right choices, Bullying, Dating Violence, building healthy relationships, anxiety/stress/mental health, defining respect and respecting others.

ECHS Parent Academy 2021-22

Parent Academy will be held immediately following the monthly PTSA business meeting. Parent Academy is designed to educated parents on varying academic subjects like college readiness, college application, studying habits, etc. In addition, Guest speakers provide presentations on internet safety, bullying, dating violence, healthy teen relationships, Title IX, etc. These Academy sessions are held monthly for one hour.

 Currently, it provides prevention education programs through its SQUAD (Students on a
 Quest Uniting Against Drugs/Alcohol) and Pop (Peer Outreach for Prevention) through
 the ECHS Health classes for Grade 9. With the ECHS College Readiness Hornet Help
 Program, Brandywine Counseling can provide more programing for families as well as
 students.
 - The Center for Child Development provides professional therapists who partner with school districts to provide mental health services directly in the schools. The therapists are trained to handle issues such as depression, anxiety, self-esteem, poor social skills, anger management, etc. Counseling is offered on a voluntary basis and provided in the school setting. Services include individual, family and group counseling, as appropriate. The CCD also provides workshops for parents and teens.

45 minute Lessons were presented for each week for four weeks for grades 6,7 & 8

The goal of *Making Proud Choices!* is to empower adolescents to change their behavior in ways that will reduce their risk of an unplanned pregnancy or becoming infected with HIV and other STIs. Specifically, this curriculum emphasizes that adolescents can reduce their risk for STIs, HIV and pregnancy by using a condom, if they choose to have sex.

The program has four major components. The first component focuses on goals, dreams and adolescent sexuality. The second is knowledge, covering information about the etiology, transmission and prevention of HIV, other STIs and teenage pregnancy. The third focuses on beliefs and attitudes. The fourth focuses on skills and self-efficacy, covering negotiation-refusal skills and condom use skills and providing time for practice, reinforcement and support.

The role of sexual responsibility and accountability is stressed, and the curriculum teaches participants to make responsible decisions regarding their sexual behavior, to respect themselves and others, and the importance of developing a positive image. Participants discuss what constitutes sexual responsibility, such as condom use and learn to make responsible decisions regarding their sexual behavior

Power Up, Speak Out!

This program includes five lessons encouraging middle school students to think critically about healthy relationships, power dynamics, boundaries, and consent. These lessons teach students what to do instead of what not to do.

These lessons will be taught to 7_{th} , 8_{th} , and 9_{th} graders through their PE/Health class during the 2021-2022 school year. Each year after (2022-2023 and beyond), the lessons will be taught to 7_{th} graders and any new students attending POCS in grades 8 and 9.

- 5 Lesson Toolkit (40-50 minutes each):
- 1. Healthy Relationships Students will define a relationship as a connection between two or more people and identify healthy relationship statements.
- 2. Power in Relationships Students will examine the concept of one-sided power and two-sided power in peer relationships and identify Red Flags.
- 3. Boundaries in Relationships Students will identify that personal boundaries are self-created, can change, and need to be respected, use the Red Flags to examine when personal boundaries are not respected, and identify "put-downs" as an example of disrespecting personal boundaries.
- 4. Consent in Relationships Students will define consent as permission to cross a boundary, identify consent forms, identify "got consent?" statements, and examine the lack of consent by applying the Red Flags and Boundaries.
- 5. Healthy Relationships in Action Students will identify conditions that make it easy or difficult for people to be themselves, be treated well, be able to say no, and have fun in their relationships, and identify how they can use their power so that everyone can be themselves in their peer and dating relationships.

Students Empowered

This is a monthly program that has been implemented to empower the identified female students who attend POCS. Our Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) organizes guest speakers and

outside agencies who instruct our students and develop lessons of our own to address issues such as body image, social media, healthy relationships, etc. During the 2022/2023 school year, identified female students would meet every couple of weeks for 45 minutes with instructors from the Delaware Adolescent Program Inc. (DAPI) to complete a 13-week curriculum called Love Notes. This has been organized through Students Empowered by our LCSW. The curriculum addresses making wise relationship and sexual choices, recognizing your values, understanding red flags of unhealthy relationships, and developing skills to form and maintain healthy relationships.

Students Empowered

This is a monthly program that has been implemented to empower the identified male students who attend POCS. Our Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) and PBIS Coordinator organize guest speakers and outside agencies who instruct our students and develop lessons of our own to address issues such as body image, social media, healthy relationships, etc. During the 2022-2023 school year, identified male students are meeting every couple of weeks for 45 minutes with instructors from the Delaware Adolescent Program Inc. (DAPI) to complete a 13-week curriculum called Love Notes. This has been organized through Guys Group by our LCSW. - (a) [Repealed.]
- (b) Educational programming. The Child Protection Accountability Commission and the Division of Family Services of the Department of Services for Children, Youth, and Their Families shall identify and maintain educational programming to be used by each school district and charter school for informing school district and charter school employees, students, and parents about personal body safety and child abuse and about how to detect and report child abuse. The educational programming must include all of the following:
- (1) Training and education for school district and charter school employees that is evidencebased, whenever available, in order to raise awareness of issues regarding personal body safety, child abuse, and child safety. Such training and education must include the warning signs indicating that a child may be a victim of sexual abuse and other forms of child abuse, techniques for responding when child abuse is suspected or disclosed, and the employee's mandatory reporting requirement under § 903 of Title 16.
- (2) Evidence-based, whenever available, age-appropriate instruction for students enrolled in grades pre-kindergarten through 6 that is related to personal body safety and sexual abuse and other forms of child abuse. Such instruction shall include information on the difference between appropriate and inappropriate conduct and the actions that a child may take to be protected from sexual abuse and other forms of child abuse. Such instruction shall be designed to build on skills learned the previous year.

- (3) Information for parents of students enrolled in grades pre-kindergarten through 6 on all of the following:
- a. Warning signs of a child who is being sexually abused or suffering from other forms of child abuse.
- b. Effective, age-appropriate methods for discussing personal body safety and sexual abuse and other forms of child abuse with a child. c. Resources for reporting child abuse.
 - d. Counseling and other resources available to a child who has been the victim of child abuse.
- (c) Role of the Department of Education. The Department of Education shall provide technical expertise to assist the Child Protection Accountability Commission and the Division of Family Services of the Department of Services for Children, Youth, and Their Families in their identification of educational programming under subsection (b) of this section and the Department of Education shall make a list of the approved educational programing available to each school district and charter school.
- (d) *Implementation of training program.* Each school district and charter school shall implement the educational programming provided under subsection (b) of this section as follows:
- (1) The educational programing provided under paragraph (b)(1) of this section must be provided to all of its employees as required by § 4162 of this title.
- (2) The educational programing provided under paragraph (b)(2) of this section must be provided to all students enrolled in grades pre-kindergarten through 6 through health education programs or related classes.
- (3) The educational programing provided under paragraph (b)(3) of this section must be provided to parents of students enrolled in grades pre-kindergarten through 6 through written materials, available online through the school district's or charter school's website or in hard copy upon a request by parents, on an annual basis and may be provided through live presentations.
- (e) *Notification of parents.* Prior to providing any instruction under paragraph (d)(2) of this section, each school district and charter school shall inform the parent of any student enrolled in grades prekindergarten through 6 in writing that the parent may examine and review the educational materials before the materials are taught. (f) *Accountability*. —
- (1) Each school district and charter school shall designate an individual responsible for overseeing the implementation of the educational programing provided under subsection (b) of this section. Each school district and charter school shall provide the name and contact information for the individual designated under this subsection to the Department of Education no later than November 15 of each year.
- (2) Each individual designated under paragraph (f)(1) of this section shall report to the Department of Education no later than November 15 of each year how the educational programming has been implemented by that individual's school district or charter school.

Middle Schools- Yes And.....Learning Consent as a Lifelong Necessity for grades 6-8. I spent 3 lessons consisting of 45 mins each in length over the course of our Consent Unit. The curriculum materials were provided by Planned Parenthood of Delaware. The materials used focused on defining what Consent is, the State of Delaware's age of Consent laws, the F.R.I.E.S. model, and a video clip demonstrating what each component of the F.R.I.E.S. model looks like. In addition, students looked at specific scenarios and determined if Consent was present or not.

High Schools- We use a variety of resources to teach Consent Education throughout our Relationships and Sexuality unit over ten class periods at 90 minutes. Consent is taught or practiced in skills based work. A curriculum resource used is Planned Parenthoods "Be Proud! Be Responsible!" Curriculum which utilizes values and consent as a large component. The students also practice accessing valid information by using the source Rainn to analyze current consent laws in Delaware. Videos like Consent as Tea, Planned Parenthood and FRIES are used to prompt discussion and explain consent. Scenarios are also analyzed to determine if Consent was present or not, students also practice the skill of communication in creating consent scripts. We also use the Yes And.....Learning Consent as a Lifelong Necessity. We covered Consent over 2 class periods which were 1.5 hours each.

At Cape Henlopen High School, the Be Proud! Be Responsible! Program was used. This is provided through Planned Parenthood. It is taught for six class periods each semester and is taught toward the end of each semester.

At the middle schools we used Planned Parenthood: "Yes, and..." curricular materials. The program consists of three modules per grade band (7-8) allowing for age-appropriate instruction. The three modules are 1. What is Consent?, 2. What is NOT Consent? And 3. How and When to Ask for Consent. This curricular resource comes with instructor professional learning to help develop instructors' skill prior to teaching as well as resources if students disclose a consent violation. The delivery takes three days of approximately 90 minutes each day and includes resources for teaching students in a remote environment as well as in-person. The Indian River School District has provided all middle and high school Health teachers with two resources: our approved *HealthSmart* curriculum and teachconsent.org. Consent education instruction is planned collaboratively through district PLCs which are held up to 3 times per year on calendared district-wide Professional Learning Days. IRSD Health teachers also have a collaborative Schoology page where they share ideas and resources that can be used in their instructional planning, including consent education.

In middle schools, consent education is delivered during an 8th grade *Family Health and Sexuality* unit which teaches students about healthy boundaries in relationships and how to communicate overall in a relationship, including communicating personal boundaries. Beginning in 2020, this 8th grade content will be adapted for use with 7th grade students as well. In high schools, consent education is covered through a unit on *Mental and Emotional* health which discusses developing and communicating healthy boundaries. The length of time engaged in consent education ranges from one full lesson that can take anywhere from 1 to 3 classroom periods of at least 40 minutes each, to two to three lessons that may take a full week of classroom instruction.

The High School Health Educators were trained by Planned Parenthood to teach Consent Education. Two different curriculums are used to teach Consent Education in the High School: Be Proud Be Responsible and Discovery Health. On the High School Level, Consent Education is covered as part of our 10th grade Health Curriculum. The High School Health Educators were trained by Planned Parenthood to teach Consent Education. Two different curriculums are used to teach Consent Education in the High School: Be Proud Be Responsible and Discovery Health. Be Proud Be Responsible is taught over 2-3 class periods (approximately 3.5 hours of instruction) and Power Point Slides are used to guide group instruction. Students also complete a worksheet that coincides with the slides. The topic of Consent is also covered again in the Sex Education chapter when use of contraceptives is discussed. Contraceptives are covered in the Discovery Health text book, but Consent is not. Teachers use supplemental materials (slides and guided group discussion) to revisit consent during this chapter. This is an additional one period (67 minutes) of instruction. All of our MHS Health classes are currently being taught in person.

Milford Central Academy

At MCA, Yes, and...Learning Consent as a Lifelong Necessity are the programs/resources used. This is covered during our 7th and 8th grade health classes. The program that is used covers the definition of sexual consent, the Delaware law regarding consent, and the FRIES model as an acronym to help the students recognize all parts of consent that need to be present. Students are provided with a note sheet with this information and then complete a matching assignment where they are given several scenarios and they have to decide if the example is consent or not, and what part of the FRIES model it falls into. At the conclusion of the lesson we discuss who are trusted adults in the student's life that they could talk to about situations regarding this topic. They are also provided with nation and state hotline numbers should they be in a situation where they feel their consent is violated.

Planned Parenthood Consent Program and the Be Proud, Be Responsible/Making Proud Choices resources for consent education are used throughout our district in Health Education classes.

Consent specific education is mixed throughout the Health courses and is taught, reviewed, and worked through multiple times during the course. Examples of how Planned Parenthood provides consent topics include, but are not limited to: students working through video lessons with evidence-based responses, question and answer discussions, affirming beliefs, practicing skills, key learnings, and role play practice.

Consent education is also covered during various units including, but not limited to: Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drugs, Human Sexuality, Social Health and Family Life Education. Activities within these areas include, but are not limited to: in person instruction, worksheets, articles, videos, class discussion, and role-play. Each of the individual schools spends time meeting the consent requirement slightly differently, however on average each school is spending anywhere from 4-6 lessons on consent education. Roughly this equates to anywhere from 2-6 hours depending on how individual instructors structure their lessons.

Highlighting Delcastle, Bonnie Lane has done tremendous work on consent education and has provided many resources to cover consent education to all of the department chairs. These activities include short stories (case study) and then follow up questions and critical thinking activities regarding consent education and decision making.
