Request for Applications (RFA) NSLP Equipment Grant FY 2023

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) has been authorized to provide grants to State Agencies to provide equipment assistance to School Food Authorities (SFAs) participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). The Delaware Department of Education (DDOE) is making awards of up to \$93,399 available for NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants through the attached Request for Application (RFA). The term "equipment" for purposes of this RFA, is defined as articles of nonexpendable, tangible, personal property with a useful life of more than one year and a per unit acquisition cost greater than \$1,000. For the FY 2023 Equipment Assistance Grants, Congress has specified that the equipment's value must be greater than \$1,000.

Funds allocated for this grant are intended to assist SFAs in purchasing equipment needed to meet the nutritional standards for schools as required by the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010. These funds should make a significant investment in addressing the unmet need in the state by allowing SFAs to purchase the equipment needed to serve healthier school meals, increase breakfast participation by implementing alternative breakfast models, and increase access to afterschool snacks and meals through the National School Lunch Program and/or the At-Risk Afterschool Meals component of the Child and Adult Care Food Program. Please note, equipment purchased with NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant funds is the property of the SFA Subgrantee throughout the life of the equipment.

Attached to this operational memo are the Request for Application and Equipment Grant Application that SFAs must complete in order to apply for the NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant. The deadline for application is **4:00 p.m. on December 19, 2023**.

# National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Equipment Assistance Grant—Fiscal Year 2023

#### **Overview/General Information**

**Announcement Date: October 9, 2023** 

**Eligible Applicants**: Each School Food Authority (SFA) participating in the federally-funded National School Lunch Program (NSLP) is eligible to submit an application for schools under their jurisdiction. A SFA is defined as a governing body which is responsible for the administration of one or more schools and has the legal authority to operate the NSLP therein.

Priority will be given to eligible SFAs 1) that did not receive equipment assistance grants in any of its schools in a previous NSLP Equipment grant (ARRA and the FYs 2010, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 Equipment grants); 2) that demonstrate high need and are able to show that the schools for which they are applying are in an underserved area; have limited access to other resources/funding to purchase equipment; and current equipment is outdated, non-functioning, or non-existent; 3) that commit to using funds to improve the quality and safety of school meals, overall energy efficiency, and/or participation; 4) whose applying schools participate in the School Breakfast Program (SBP); and 5) whose applying schools are self-operated and/or provide satellite meals to other schools participating in NSLP.

Grant Award: Delaware's FY2023 NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants provides \$99,399 under the FY2023 Consolidated Appropriations Act (CAA), hereafter referred to as "FY23 CAA", for grants to eligible SFAs to assist in purchasing equipment needed to meet the nutritional standards as required by the Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010. Delaware will award sub grants to SFAs with qualifying schools on a competitive basis. Applications will be ranked by score, from highest to lowest. The number of grants to be awarded will not be determined until the application scoring and ranking process is completed. Grant funding under the NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant program will be provided on a reimbursement basis to successful applicants. Please note: The FY2023 NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants are contingent on the availability of funding.

**Grant Period**: The grant period will begin no sooner than January 22, 2024 and will extend from the execution date of the grant agreement until June 30, 2025. All purchases must be made after the award (Subgrant Notice) has been issued. All funds must be expended by the end of the grant period; however, the final Claim for Reimbursement for NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant funds, including invoices, must be received no later than August 31, 2025.

**Counterparts:** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and both of which taken together shall constitute one and the same document. A signature delivered by facsimile shall be considered binding for both parties.

### **Grant Program Detail/Background and Program Specifications**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has been authorized to provide grants to State Agencies to provide equipment assistance to SFAs participating in the NSLP. The Delaware Department of Education (DDOE) is making awards of \$99,399 available for NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants available through this RFA. The NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant is similar in scope to the previous NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants (ARRA and the FYs 2010, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 Equipment grants); however, these programs are authorized by different statutes and have different reporting requirements.

Funds allocated for this program are intended to assist SFAs in purchasing equipment needed to meet the nutritional standards for schools as required by the Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010. These funds should make a significant investment in addressing the unmet need in the state by allowing SFAs to purchase the equipment needed to serve healthier school meals, improve food safety, and help support the establishment, maintenance, or expansion of the SBP.

The term "equipment," for purposes of this RFA, is defined as articles of nonexpendable, tangible personal property with a useful life of more than one year and the equipment must have a value greater than \$1,000.

#### **Fiscal Information**

For purposes of compliance with Section 511 of Public Law 101-166 (the *Stevens Amendment*), applicants are advised that 100 percent of the funds for this program are derived from federal sources.

Funding under the NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant program will be provided on a reimbursement basis. Each SFA selected to receive funds must submit one Claim for Reimbursement which must include copies of the invoice(s) for each approved item of equipment that was purchased, replaced, or renovated. Funds cannot be reimbursed for equipment ordered prior to the date of an executed grant agreement, nor can funds be used for equipment other than what is specified in the award letter. All NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant funds must

be expended no later than September 30, 2025.

Since the program will be funded on a reimbursement basis, SFAs are advised that the amount of the final grant award is contingent upon actual purchase costs. As such, the final grant amount may change and be the lesser of the grant award and the actual allowable expenses submitted for reimbursement.

#### Allowable Costs

NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant funds **may** be used for the following:

- Purchase of new equipment,
- Renovation of existing equipment, and
- Replacement of existing equipment.

\*For the FY 2023 Equipment Assistance Grants, Congress has specified that the equipment's value must be greater than \$1,000. Grantees should keep in mind that this lower purchase threshold only applies to FY 2023 equipment grant funds.

Examples of equipment include, but are not limited to: refrigeration (reach-in or walk-in, if efficiently sized), preparation equipment (convection oven, combination oven, steamer, tilt skillet, food processor), serving line (effective flow and components including merchandising), holding cabinet, dishwasher, shelving, salad bar, food transport carts and carriers. SFAs are reminded that each unit must have a useful life of more than one year and the equipment must have a value greater than \$1,000.

NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant funds may not be used for the following:

- Renovation of the food service area,
- Facility renovation and construction costs,
- Administrative expenses,
- Indirect costs, and
- Set-asides for auditing services.
