Flexible Funding Investment (05297)	Cost	Expected Impact (Explain the expected impact of this investment on multilingual learners and/or students experiencing poverty.)
* Assistant Principal	* \$ 145,643.00	* The continuation (since the inception of this funding) of an instructional leader to our secondary program allows for targeted support for our Humanities subjects. The AP role allows for more one-on-one planning, consistent weekly planning and instructional support. The Assistant Principal focused on humanities allows for more strategic support for all of our students, specifically our low-income and EL population. The investment is measured through the percentage of students meeting growth targets on NWEA (Map). The target is for at least 50% of students to meet their individual MAP growth target in ELA.
* Instructional Coach	* \$ 127,967.00	* The instructional coach provides even more intensive support to teachers who are struggling with specific action steps and lesson plan execution. This position allows for us to provide targeted support to our teachers in order to ensure that learning is happening at an optimal level. Studies have shown that low-income and EL students are disproportionately performing below their peers in the same grade level. In order to close learning deficits, it is paramount for instructors to be able to implement a plethora of pedagogical approaches in response to student data. Direct coaching support is imperative to develop our instructors and this role will provide the support needed to our instructors, particularly as it pertains to our low income population. This investment is measured through the percentage of students meeting growth targets on NWEA (Map). The target is for at least 50% of our students to meet their MAP growth target.
* Special Education teacher	* \$ 81,322.00	* Following the pandemic, we have experienced an increase in our students with special needs who are performing significantly below grade level, specifically in reading. This position will serve students with IEPs in grades 3-8 with targeted reading intervention and support. The target for this role is for at least 50% of the assigned students to meet their ELA MAP growth target.

* Social Emotional supplies and manipulatives	* \$ 6,500.32	* Supportive materials for students needing additional social emotional resources. Using our jag system, students are given the opportunity to earn their way into the bimonthly jag events. Students ability to appropriately self-regulate is a key causal factor to their participation in this event. The target for this support alongside other SEL supports provided is that at least 85% of our population will participate in the bimonthly jag events.
