* Academic Interventionist	* \$ 51,907.08	* An Academic Interventionist will have a caseload of students to manage their academic progress during the course of the year. The Academic Interventionist will ensure they are receiving the supports needed to become college ready and to be successful completing college level work. CIS will provide academic assistance, behavior interventions, community and service learning, family engagement, mental health supports, basic needs, college and career prep, enrichment, life skills, and physical health support.
* Para-educator	* \$ 45,545.55	* The Para-educator will provide academic support for students who are serviced by an IEP. The Para-educator will help with improving academic achievement and social outcomes for students. Para Educators can also help teachers manage classrooms and ensure that all students have access to the same quality education.
