* Reading Interventionist (Grades 3-12)	* \$ 69,000.00	* Working directly with the Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Team, the Reading Interventionist will help identify strategies and resources to support at-risk populations. Students will be pulled in small groups on a weekly basis in order to receive intervention support, specifically in reading. Students will be using not only direct instruction by the teacher, but also instruction through programs such as Amplify's Boost, i-Ready, and Magnetics. Through these additional supports, the students will become proficient readers and improve their performance on ELA assessments, as well as Smarter Balanced and i-Ready assessments.
