* Manager of Curriculum and Instruction	* \$ 104,000.00	

		<p>* The Manager of Curriculum and Instruction will oversee the development and implementation of curricular programming K-12 for Odyssey Charter School. Mrs. Juliana Sheehan manages the Curriculum and Instruction Coordinator, Testing Administrator, K-12 Instructional Coaches and content Interventionists. Additionally, she will ensure the required state reports are completed and implemented throughout all schools. Part of the role of the Manger of Curriculum and Instruction is to monitor the success of the curriculum and identify strategies to support at-risk populations. She will provide check-ins with the academic team to provide students with additional services received through the MTSS program. With a focus of literacy, Mrs. Juliana Sheehan will monitor the adopted program Amplify CKLA in grades K-5, and the continuous implementation of McGraw Hill's StudySync in grades 6-12. Part of the Amplify CKLA purchase is access to their Boost Learning Program. This is an immersive story-based reading program that accelerates students' learning development. Using this story-based approach, students are not only learning to read but reading to learn. Students complete a diagnostic, or benchmark assessment, during their first session to determine their reading ability. Once determined, they are placed in a path carved from Boost's comprehensive skill maps that cover 14 skilled domains based in the science of reading. Boost is game based which keeps students engaged in their learning. Each game comes with scaffolds that adapt to the students' needs as they play. If they continue to struggle, more scaffolding becomes available to help them succeed. If students are struggling with a specific skill, Boost flags this skill as a trouble spot in the teacher dashboard. Using this data, teachers will pull students individually and in small groups to work with their students to ensure their success. Using this program, the team will work directly with teachers using the Boost Reading Dashboard to assess the progress of low-income and MLL students' performance over the course of the year. The program seamlessly places students in small groups for targeted, staff-led intervention. In order to support this subgroup, the team will provide assistance to teachers with Boost to help reinforce the skills the students are learning in their core curriculum. Through these additional supports provided within Amplify CKLA, students will become proficient readers and improve their performance on ELA assessments, as well as Smarter Balanced and iReady over the course of the school year. Mrs. Sheehan will oversee the work with the 6-12 ELA department to analyze formative and summative data for sub-populations to identify areas of needs and targeted instruction. Included in StudySync, self, peer and teacher evaluations are included in every unit lesson to provide teachers with a wide variety of formative assessment options. The summative assessments at the end of each unit includes progress monitoring tools and targeted lessons for reteaching and remediation to make sure teachers are meeting the needs of all of their learners. Mrs. Sheehan will also track the progress of low-income and MLL students' ELA performance over the course of the year to identify programs and services to support this subgroup. StudySync MLL skill lessons will be used as a resource to emphasize explicit vocabulary instruction, language acquisition, and reading comprehension. Through these additional supports, the students will improve their performance on ELA assessments, as well as Smarter Balanced, i-Ready, and PSATs over the course of the school year.</p>

Mrs. Karen Erskine will implement research-based instructional frameworks through mentoring and coaching, and assist teachers with planning, classroom strategies and best practices. The Instructional Coach will work side-by-side with teachers to improve student learning outcomes, focusing on the subgroup populations. At least 80% of Mrs. Karen Erskine's time will be directly supporting teacher development and student learning. The Coach does not merely tell others or demonstrate "how to do it," they actually "do it" as they provide on-going, job-embedded professional learning and support.</p>

The Special Education Instructional Coach will work side-by-side with teachers and the department to improve student learning outcomes for students receiving services. At least 80% of their time will be directly supporting teacher development and student learning. The Coach does not merely tell others or demonstrate "how to do it," they actually "do it" as they provide on-going, job-embedded professional learning and support.

* i-Ready Curriculum for Grades K-8	* \$ 100,000.00	* Odyssey Charter School will be implementing i-Ready in Math and ELA as an assessment and instructional program. Students who are multilingual and students with socioeconomic disadvantages will use i-Ready Personalized Instruction for an average of 60 minutes or more per subject per week over the course of the school year. i-Ready will provide teachers with data that will pinpoint student needs down to sub-skill level through a valid and reliable adaptive Diagnostic. The assessment will identify learning loss and skills gaps and receive recommendations for immediate solutions with iReady reports. This program will reach key student groups of all skill levels with digital instruction designed to fill each student's knowledge gaps and help every learner access grade-level content. It will also engage students with interactive instruction designed for modern standards.
