## DETAILS OF SERVICES

Listed below are explanations of each of the educational services provided by the departments of Education, Health and Social Services and Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

### Department of Education

#### ***Adult & Prison Education***

The Department of Education provides an Adult Basic Education program for adult offenders whom are incarcerated in the State's Level V correctional facilities (Sussex Correctional Institution, James T. Vaughn Correctional Center, Baylor Women's Correctional Institution and Howard R. Young Correctional Institution).

Newly committed offenders are assessed for current functioning level educational placement. The academic program's accountability is based upon mutually agreed upon performance levels between the Delaware Department of Education and U.S. Department of Education. Students who attain a secondary assessment certificate may enroll in James H. Groves Adult High School courses offered at the correctional facility. Prison Education also works with regionally or nationally certified colleges to monitor post-secondary course delivery paid for by the offenders during their period of incarceration.

Prison Education also provides vocational courses at three correctional facilities, including HVAC, plumbing, masonry, culinary arts, auto technology and network wiring.

### Department of Health and Social Services

#### ***Division for the Visually Impaired (DVI)***

The DVI Education team provides statewide educational services to children and youth from birth through the completion of high school (up to age 22). Itinerant services are provided to eligible students and their families in a variety of settings including public, charter and private schools, early intervention learning centers, healthcare facilities, and private homes for infants, toddlers, homebound, and home-schooled children.

DVI education professionals use the Expanded Core Curriculum (ECC) concepts and practices to provide direct and consultative services to support students with their education goals. Additionally, the DVI coordinates ancillary services to ensure children have the necessary tools and services to advance their education and meet their IEP goals. These services include the production of adapted school materials and textbooks (i.e., Braille, large print, digital, audio, etc.), the acquisition of vision related assistive technology (AT) equipment and software, AT instruction, the facilitation of vision examinations and eyeglass purchases, and orientation and mobility services.

#### ***Stockley Center***

Educational services for school-aged residents (ages 4-20) of the Stockley Center are provided by the Howard T. Ennis School. The Ennis School is part of the Indian River School District and serves the educational needs of students with moderate to severe and profound disabilities in Sussex County.

### Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families

#### ***Cleveland White School***

The Cleveland White School serves the residential student population from the Grace, Snowden and Mowlds cottages located in Wilmington. Services are provided to male and female students between the ages of 12 and 18. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***Ferris School***

The Ferris School is a secure treatment facility for committed males, ages 13 to 18. It is operated by the Division of Youth Rehabilitative Services and offers a structured learning environment that integrates all elements of rehabilitation: Education, programming, treatment and therapeutic clinical programs. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***New Castle County Detention Center***

The New Castle County Detention Center is a secure facility serving pre-adjudicated males and females under the age of 18. It is operated by the Division of Division of Youth Rehabilitative Services. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***Silver Lake Treatment Center***

The Silver Lake Treatment Center provides day treatment and educational services. The Center is operated by the Division of Prevention and Behavioral Health Services and serves clients ranging from 12-17 years of age. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***Stevenson House Detention Center***

This Stevenson House Detention Center is a secure detention facility for pre-adjudicated male and female youth under the age of 18. It is operated by the Division of Youth Rehabilitative Services. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***Terry Children's Psychiatric Center***

The Terry Children's Psychiatric Center is a psychiatric facility providing a continuum of care for children under the age of 13. It is operated by the Division of Prevention and Behavioral Health Services. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***Silver Lake Treatment Center***

The Silver Lake Treatment Center provides day treatment and educational services. The Center is operated by the Division of Prevention and Behavioral Health Services and serves clients ranging from 12-17 years of age. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***Stevenson House Detention Center***

This Stevenson House Detention Center is a secure detention facility for pre-adjudicated male and female youth under the age of 18. It is operated by the Division of Youth Rehabilitative Services. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.

#### ***Terry Children's Psychiatric Center***

The Terry Children's Psychiatric Center is a psychiatric facility providing a continuum of care for children under the age of 13. It is operated by the Division of Prevention and Behavioral Health Services. Educational services are provided by certified educational personnel employed by the Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.
